**THE COMPLETE WEB DESIGN COURSE** is an introduction to all the necessary fundamentals for creating a Web site and publishing it online. In this crash course, students will be able to design a Web site, post it to the Web, and view the results online.

The course lasts for three days, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day. Attendees are welcome to bring and use their MacBook® or other laptops if they wish. Training and handouts are based on the latest versions of Adobe® Dreamweaver®, Photoshop®, and Flash®.

**Prerequisites:** Knowledge of Mac® or Windows® OS. Experience with graphics, MS Office®, and Adobe® creative applications is essential.
